Enduring Light Campaign



In the early 1970s, over \$54,000 was spent mostly on building materials and supplies for the initial facilities. Adjusting for inflation, that is equal to over \$358,000 in today's dollars.

Our Legacy

Over **fifty** years ago, in 1969, the Hillbrook Christian Association was formed with a donation of 54.5 acres of land. Parcels of this land have since been donated to the Tennessee Children's Home and the Southeast Institute of Biblical Studies. Hillbrook now focuses on providing facilities for **Christian camps and retreats** on the remaining 32 acres of land.

This Campaign

These facilities have served well over the past 50 years, but are in need of repairs and updates. Hillbrook **needs your help** in raising the money to make renovations and to build new cabins.

- Phase I - **\$250,000**
- Phase I - Renovate kitchen and cooks quarters, build new cabin for nurse, directors, and laundry facilities.
- Phase II - **\$1,000,000**
- Phase II - Build new conditioned cabins with in-cabin bathing facilities and separate quarters for counselors.

Planning for the Future

Why Change Camp?

- We want **more people** to experience the **life changing** events that take place here.
- Screened-in cabins are a bit too rustic for some people. While hundreds of kids attend summer camp at Hillbrook each year, others choose not to attend, or choose to go elsewhere, because of the lack of **air conditioning**. We want to be **accommodating** to everyone.
- Renovations that include conditioned spaces will provide **more comfortable** and accessible facilities for **all ages**, and will allow Hillbrook to be used throughout the year.
- By making room for multiple adults in each cabin, and providing them with their own sleeping and bathing areas, we can provide a **safer environment** with less risk for both kids and adults.
- Our insurer is requiring us to make changes to our kitchen and other facilities to reduce risk and to meet **modern building** codes.
- Buildings don't last forever. Most of our facilities were built in the early 1970s, and many of the buildings have only seen minor improvements since then. We need to make improvements, because we want Hillbrook to **last forever!**

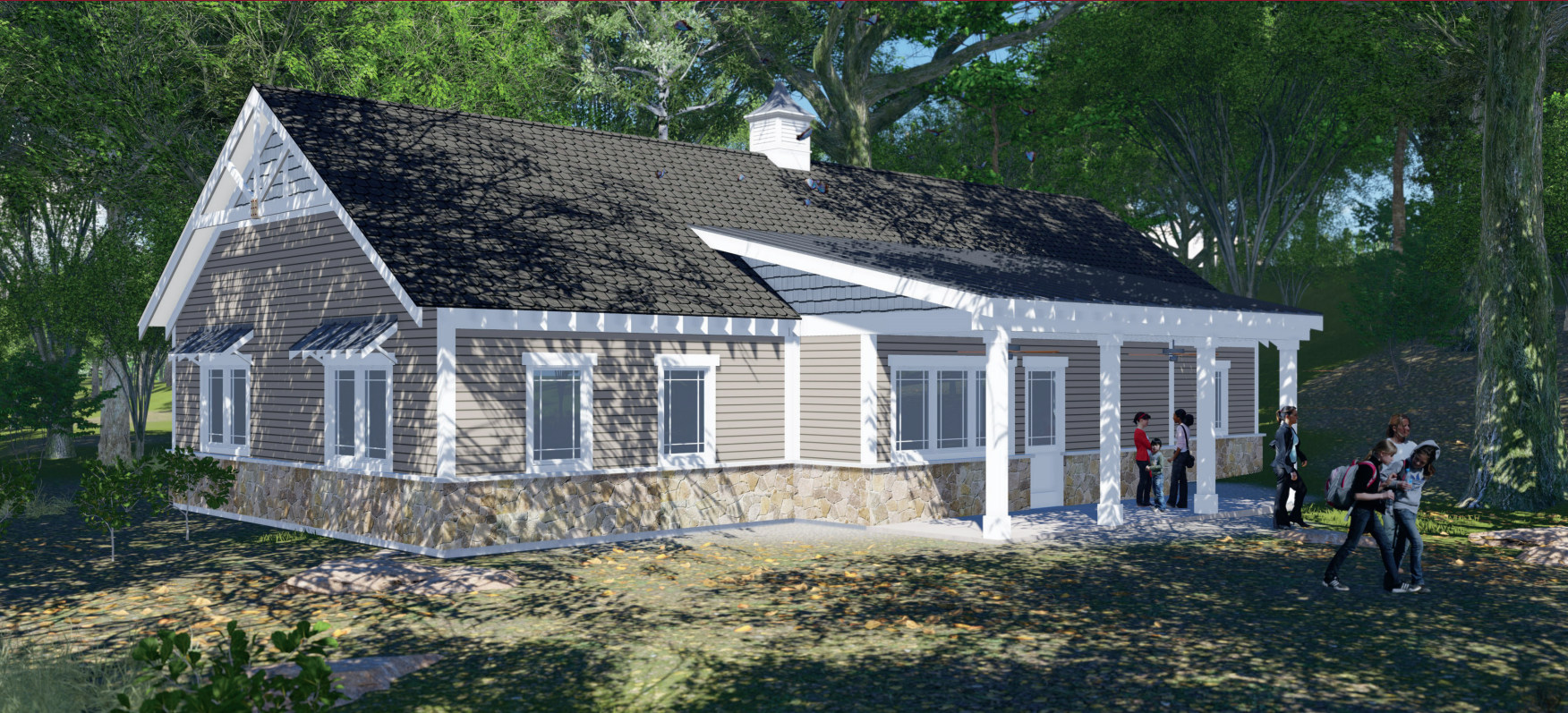

Each year, it takes over 15,000 volunteer hours, and tens of thousands of dollars to operate Hillbrook and TCC.

About Hillbrook

Hillbrook is more than just land and cabins. Hillbrook has long been a place of spiritual renewal and mutual encouragement. Lifelong friendships are formed here. Marriage partners meet here. Spiritual births and renewals take place here. We live together, play together, worship together, learn together, and share with one another here. We leave here energized and ready to make our community and world a better place. Most importantly, we leave here better prepared to love and serve our God and each other.

The Hillbrook campground and facilities are available for reservations by members and groups from churches of Christ for a reasonable fee, which helps to recoup some of the direct costs associated with their stay.

Hillbrook is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, and donations are considered by the IRS as deductible for federal income tax purposes. Its board of directors consist of faithful Christians from various churches of Christ in the East Tennessee area.

About TCC

Teenage Christian Camp (TCC) is dedicated to the training of young people spiritually, mentally, socially and physically in an ideal environment of a camp, in order that they might render greater service to God, church, home and country.

TCC has been in continual operation since 1966. It began conducting its camps at the Hillbrook campground once appropriate facilities were built in the early 1970s. TCC originally started as a camp for teenagers, but it later expanded to include younger kids. TCC operates six weeks of summer youth camp, and any boy or girl between the ages of 8 to 19, regardless of race or religious affiliation, is welcome to come.

There are currently two weeks of camp for ages 13-19, three weeks for ages 8-13, and one week for ages 11-15.

TCC is a non-profit organization under a board of directors of Christian men who feel that this is an effective means of teaching Christ and developing spirituality in our young people.



In 2018, there were 21 baptisms and 18 restorations during the 6 weeks of TCC.



Last year, kids from 67 churches of Christ and 38 denominations attended TCC.

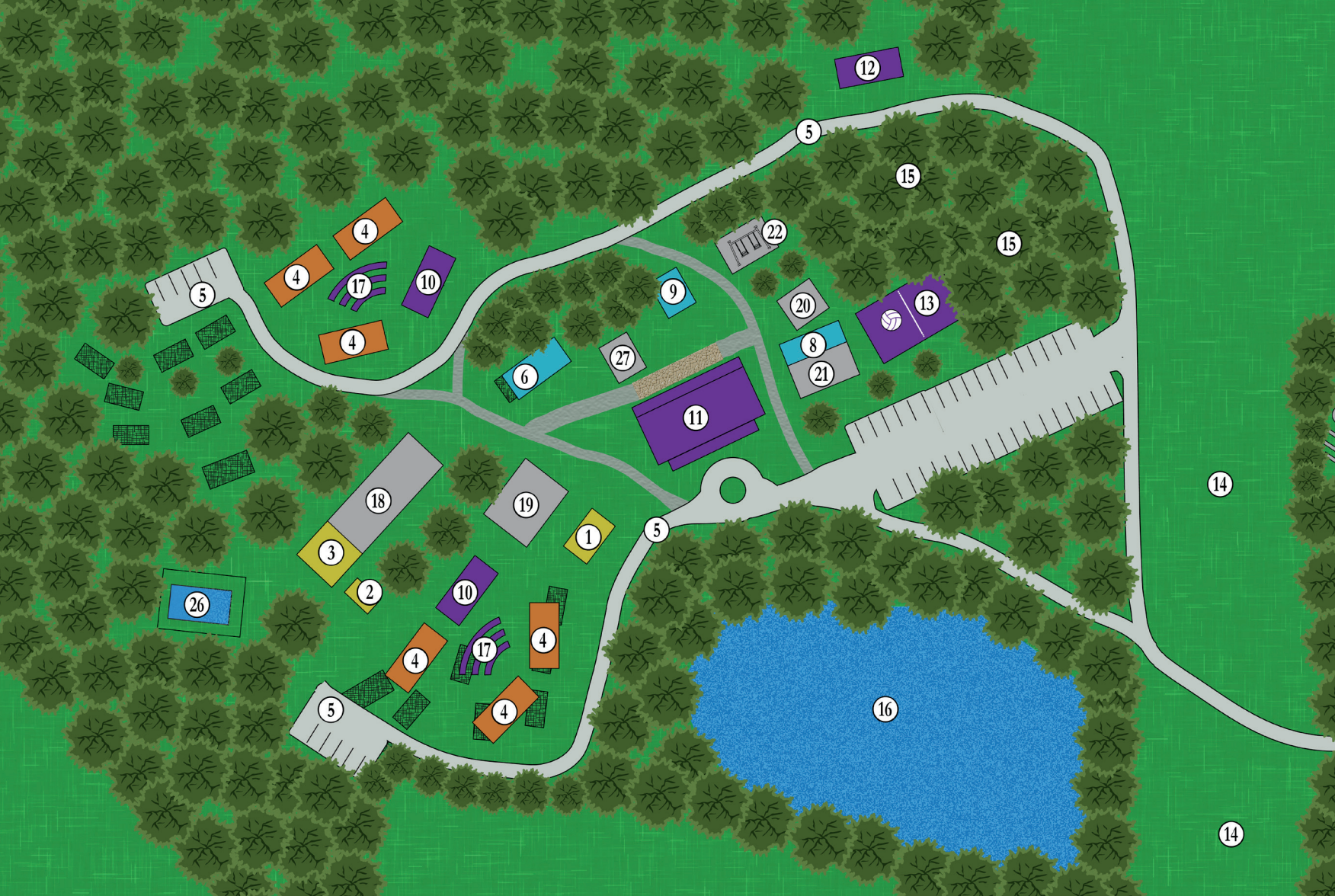

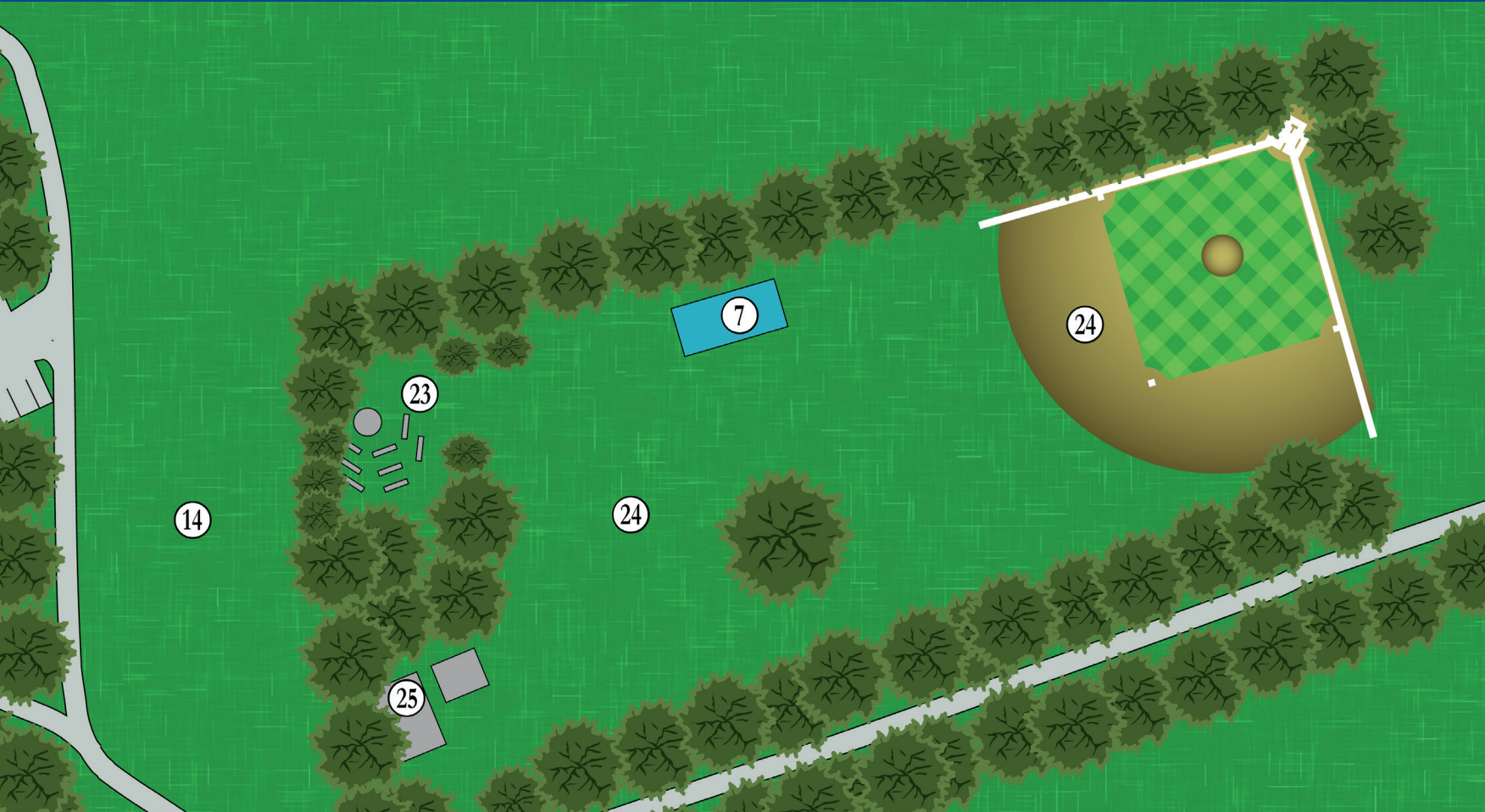

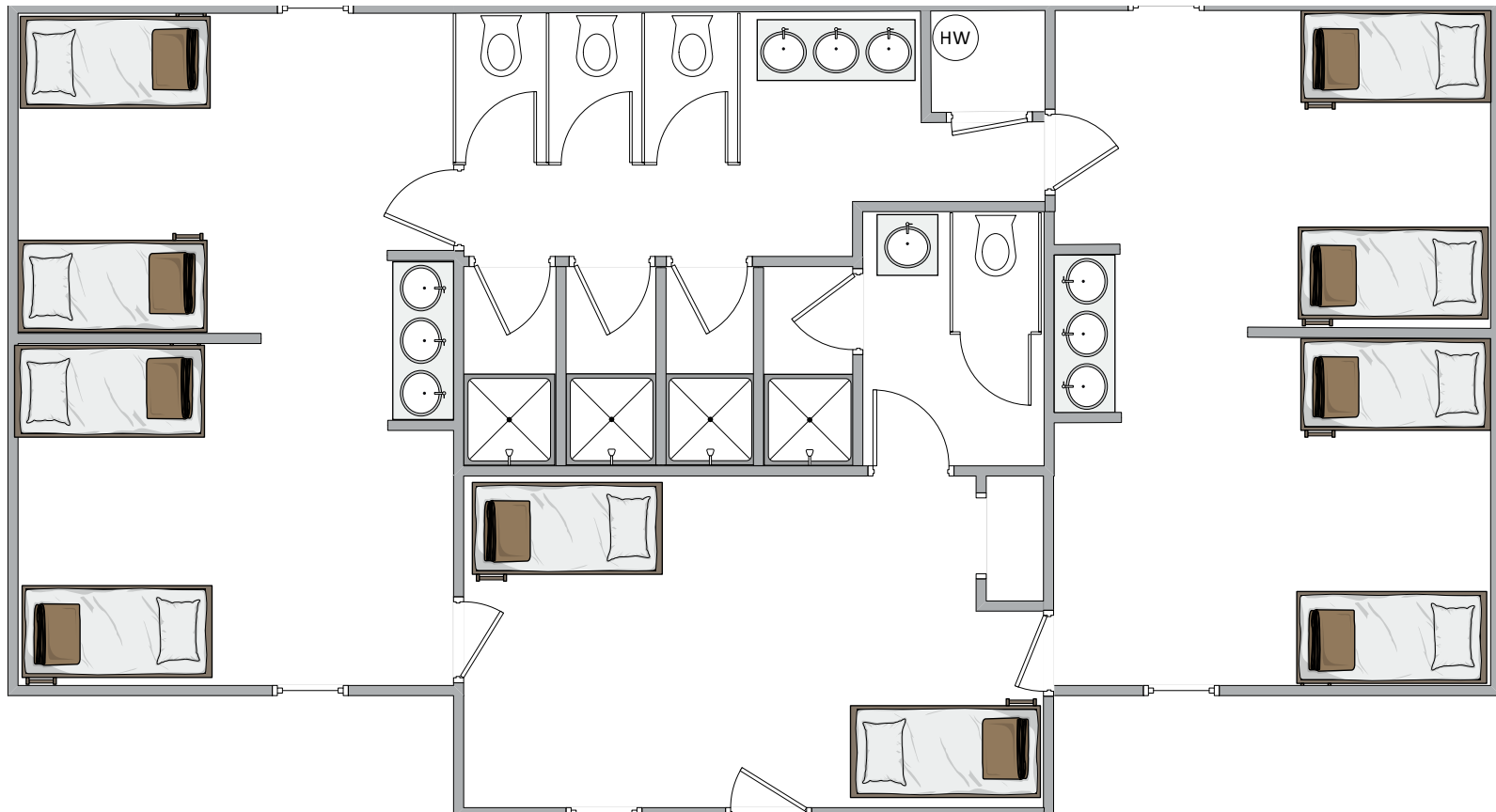
